

## Wellness Committee

### Be Informed about Bee Stings

One-third of our daily diet comes from crops pollinated by honey bees. Bees are usually on a mission and don't go out of their way to attack but they will sting as a defensive action against a perceived threat. To reduce your chance of an encounter with honey bees, avoid eating and drinking sweet foods and beverages outside, tightly cover food containers and trash cans when outdoors, and when outdoors, wear a long sleeved shirt, a hat, and shoes; also drive with vehicle windows closed.

Bee stings are usually just an outdoor annoyance that can produce different reactions, from temporary discomfort to a severe allergic reaction. It is possible to have a different reaction each time you are stung. Minor reactions include instant sharp, burning pain at the sting site, a red welt at the sting area, a small white spot where the stinger punctured the skin, and/or slight swelling around the sting area. In these cases, remove the stinger as quickly as possible by scraping the stinger out with the edge of a credit card or fingernail. If using tweezers, avoid squeezing the attached venom sac which can release more venom causing a larger reaction. Wash the sting area with soap and water, then apply cold compresses or a paste made from baking soda or meat tenderizer and water. If you experience extreme redness and swelling at the site of the sting after washing the site well and applying cold compresses, apply hydrocortisone cream or Calamine lotion. Taking an oral antihistamine such as Benadryl or ChlorTrimeton may reduce itching and swelling.

Approximately 3 percent of people stung by a bee experience a severe allergic reaction (anaphylaxis). Indications include hives, itching and flushed or pale skin on parts of the body other than the sting area; difficulty breathing; swelling of the throat or tongue; a weak and rapid pulse; and/or nausea, vomiting or diarrhea. Emergency treatment is required if you experience two or more symptoms. Those who have a severe allergic reaction to a bee sting, have a 30 to 60 percent chance of having anaphylaxis the next time they are stung.

If you are stung multiple times (more than twelve) the accumulation of venom may result in nausea, vomiting or diarrhea, headache, vertigo, fainting, convulsions, and/or fever. Children, the elderly, and those with heart or breathing problems are most at risk when stung multiple times. Multiple stings are more likely if you encounter a swarm or hive of Africanized honey bees. These bees are appearing more frequently. Attacks are often triggered by loud noises such as weed eaters or lawn mowers and barking dogs or if they feel the swarm or hive is in danger. Only bee keepers or exterminators should attempt to move a large colony or swarm of bees. If you find yourself in the midst of a swarm of bees run away from the bees as quickly as possible without waving or flailing your arms. Cover your head as much as possible without slowing your progress because bees target the head and eyes. Try to get to the shelter of a building or car. Jumping into the nearest swimming pool is not recommended because the bees may wait for you to come up for air.
